

gloom, Spain is ideal. You can ride year-round and the dirt is often in prime condition in winter. An hour's drive from the capital lies the 2,428m Peñalara mountain, the highest in the Sierra de Guadarrama range. There's an abundance of great trails in the area everything from high-alpine singletrack to

boulder fields and rocks aplenty. Don't go expecting smooth bike-park motorways this is raw, natural mountain biking with only a few manmade berms and jumps around - and be warned that you will need a guide. You can either pedal your way around or use shuttles to take the sting out of the climbing.

TRAVEL

Multiple UK airports Spanish capital (from £60 return). Driving via France is possible, but a long trek. Alternatively, take the overnight ferry to Santander or Bilboa, from where it's a fourhour drive to Madrid.

Hafjell's main stage may be its World Cup track, but there's more to this Norwegian bike park than just body and wheel-pummelling rock gardens. It's home to myriad flow trails that give even the likes of Whistler a run for their money. What began as undercover digging on the ski hill has evolved into a trail network spanning two lifts, with 16 options to choose from and more

springing up each year, including 'Rollercoaster', a 1.6km string of high-speed berms and floaty tabletops that's Scandinavia's answer to A-Line. Stray beyond the bike park's upper reaches and you'll discover a paradise of natural singletrack crisscrossing the high-alpine plateaux, with rocky ribbons of dirt snaking between boulders and low bushes.
